NEW UPDATED ONLINE INTERNET ADVANCEMENTS ON COUNCIL WEBSITE

Sign in with your Unit ID # and create your password to set up your account. You will be logged into BTC's official website. When you enter new advancements to a youth's record, you are recording it in our system. Other new updates include:

- **View Previous Advancement Reports.** This new feature provides access to the List of Reports Submitted for the unit. No longer will a unit have only one opportunity to get the advancement report online or be required to contact the council to obtain a prior report that was submitted.
- **Academic and Sports Belt Loops.** Cub Scout packs may enter and submit the dates on which Belt Loops have been earned by pack members. This feature is available by Multiple Person Entry and individual entry.
- **Tiger Cub Rank.** Cub Scout packs may enter completion of the Tiger Cub rank for members who earned the award as a Tiger Cub but did not have it entered in their records.

NOW IS THE TIME TO MAKE SURE YOUR UNIT IS 100% YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINED!!!

Youth Protection training is required for all BSA registered volunteers, regardless of their position. New leaders are required to take Youth Protection training before submitting an application for registration. The certificate of completion for this training must be submitted at the time the application is made and before volunteer service with youth begins. Youth Protection training must be taken every two years. If a volunteer's Youth Protection training record is not current at the time of recharter, the volunteer will not be reregistered.

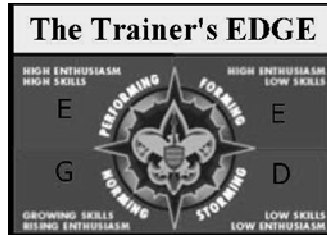
