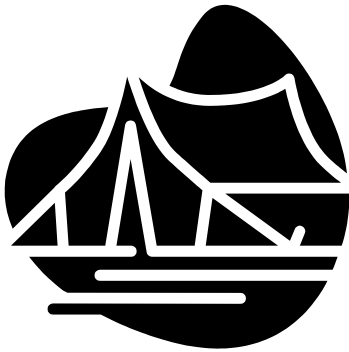


APPLICATIONS NOW BEING ACCEPTED FOR CAMPMASTERS



The Council Campmaster Corps is accepting applications now thru January 30, 2012, from registered Scouters interested in joining the elite corps or volunteers. You will be expected to work at least three weekends a year.

As a Campmaster you will be a member of the Council Committee at Large and will receive a Campmaster's name tag, Campmaster's hat and be authorized to wear the Council Committee Badge of Office and Trained Strip.

When you are serving as Campmaster, you are representing the Buffalo Trace Council and are required to wear the complete Cub Scout, Boy Scout or Venture Field (Class A) Uniform. The units are our customers and you will be expected to do everything possible to make their stay at OBSR pleasant. Your duties will be a combination of property supervisor, program resource, and safety officer.

During your tour of duty you may be required to handle electrical, water or structural emergencies and make minor repairs.

While on duty you will stay in the Campmaster's Lodge which has heat, air conditioning, restrooms, showers and a fully stocked kitchen. There are 6 beds in the Lodge, and you are invited to bring your family at no charge.

If accepted, you must attend Campmaster training at Old Ben Scout Reservation, from 9 AM to 3 PM (CST), Saturday, **February 18, 2012**. Training will consist of classroom and a tour of the camp. Wear warm clothes, hiking boots and bring rain gear.
