VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT



SCOTT FENNEMAN

Scott Fenneman comes from a long line of scouts and scouters. His family history has been intertwined with the scouting movement almost from the beginning of scouting in the United States. In 1923 Scott's Grandfather Frank S. Fenneman, founded and served as Scoutmaster of Troop 2 at Bayard Park Methodist Church. In 1937, Troop 2 merged with Troop I at Methodist Temple, later renumbered Troop 30I. Scott has served as the Committee Chair for Troop 30I for nearly 10 years and they recently celebrated 100 years of consecutive service, making them the oldest Troop in the Buffalo Trace Council. Following in the footsteps of his father Robert J. Fenneman Sr., Scott earned the rank of Eagle Scout along with his three brothers and two nephews.

Nearly 25 years after his involvement as a youth, Scott was asked to head up the then fledgling Council Popcorn sale. Serving in that capacity for most of the next 20 years, the council sale grew by nearly IO-fold to reach \$1,250,000 in sales. His group initiated the Council Popcorn Kick-Off Event, the Leader's Guidebook, the Prize Program, and a popcorn-related Salesmanship Merit Badge program.

Scott has served in many Buffalo Trace Council roles since returning to scouting. These positions include the Council Executive Board since the early 1990s, Council Commissioner, Executive Committee member, Scout Center Development Committee member, Properties Committee member, and an Ole Buzzard.

As an Ole Buzzard, Scott was one of the many members who provided maintenance to the Old Ben Scout Reservation. Keeping the torch lit, Scott is part of an effort to establish a new group camping area for use by scouts and other youth at Methodist Temple's Temple Hills Retreat Center in Pike County, IN.

Scott was awarded the Silver Beaver in 1995 and became a James E. West Fellow in 2008.

Scott has worked in television, radio, corporate, and advertising agency marketing, management, and ownership roles outside of scouting. In 1996, he founded and still serves as president of Ovation Grafix, a marketing design, printing, mailing, and sign company. Now that he is semi-retired, he enjoys working in the woods, taking care of his yard, traveling, hobby welding, and mechanics. Scott Fenneman has devoted a large portion of his adult life to scouting, hoping to preserve and grow the program for future generations of scouts and scouting families. BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

2023 MEMBERSHIP FEES EFFECTIVE AUGUST 1, 2023

Beginning August 1, 2023, all new youth and adult members who join Scouting will be enrolled in a 12-month membership cycle and BSA will cease prorating fees. Both youth and adults will pay the full annual membership fee and will renew their membership on the anniversary date of joining Scouting. All pro-ration of membership fees will be eliminated. Each registered member of the BSA will receive an email notification with a registration renewal link beginning 60 days before the anniversary date they joined Scouting. Unit Leaders will receive a copy of the email and should stay engaged in the membership renewal process just like rechartering.

It is important to note, existing members will renew their membership during their normal registration/recharter cycle through February 2024. Moving forward all members will renew on their anniversary date.

- Existing members' Anniversary date will be their unit recharter month.
- New members' Anniversary date will be the month they joined.

This new process will help streamline the rechartering and membership renewal process for units and councils. Additional information on this membership renewal process will be forthcoming in the very near future.

As the weather heats up, many of our Scouts are excited to jump in the water and start their aquatic adventures. However, it is crucial to teach them about water safety before they dive in. The Cub Scout program has a helpful tool for introducing younger Scouts to water safety rules. However, it is important to note that the SCOUT water safety chant is not a substitute for the Safe Swim Defense or Safety Afloat programs. Adults trained in these areas should always be present during any aquatic activity like swimming, boating, etc.

WATER SAFETY CHANT

S: Someone's Watching

Never swim alone.

C: Check the Rules

Know where you can roam.

O: Only Buddies

Should go from the shore.

U: Know What "U" Can Do

Don't do any more.

T: Tell a Grown Up

If someone's In need

SCOUT shows safety: Now you take the lead.

SAFE SWIM DEFENSE

Safe Swim Defense is a set of guidelines and policies that promote safe swimming and water activities in Scouting. While the SCOUT water safety chant is a helpful tool for introducing young Scouts to water safety rules, it is not a substitute for Safe Swim Defense. Safe Swim Defense goes beyond the basic safety rules outlined in the chant and includes requirements such as adult supervision, swim classification, personal flotation devices, and emergency procedures. The SCOUT water safety chant can be a useful supplement to Safe Swim Defense by helping young Scouts remember the essential safety rules, but it is important to remember that Safe Swim Defense is the foundation of safe aquatic activities in Scouting.

SAFETY AFLOAT

Safety Afloat is a set of guidelines and policies that promote safe boating and watercraft activities in Scouting. Similarly to Safe Swim Defense, the SCOUT water safety chant is not a substitute for Safety Afloat. Safety Afloat includes requirements such as proper training and certification, adult supervision, equipment and gear, emergency procedures, and more. The SCOUT water safety chant can be a helpful supplement to Safety Afloat by emphasizing key safety rules like wearing life jackets and always having a buddy, but it is crucial to remember that Safety Afloat is the foundation of safe boating and watercraft activities in Scouting.




