BRIAN MARKET

Brian Market started his scouting journey as a Cub Scout in Boonville, IN. After rising through the ranks he crossed over to Troop 161 where he earned the rank of Eagle Scout. Brian remained active in his troop after earning his Eagle Scout and eventually became a Junior Assistant Scoutmaster. After he turned 18, he stayed with the troop for another 12 years as an Assistant Scoutmaster. Brian was the young fun leader who concentrated on program and adventure trips.

After his stint as the Assistant Scoutmaster of Troop 161, Brian took a short break from scouting to finish college and start a family. When Brian's youngest child Ben started 1st grade, he found himself back in scouting. Brian immediately took a leadership role as a den leader for pack 374 and was an integral part of running the pack while his son worked towards his Arrow of Light.



After Brian and his son crossed over into troop 374, the pack started struggling with leadership. Brian took the position of Cubmaster and proceeded to build the pack numbers back up by recruiting heavily at the elementary school, utilizing his musical talents and monkey bridges.

With the pack built back up, a new leader accepted the role of Cubmaster. Brian handed over the reins of the pack and took on the role of Scoutmaster for the troop. Everything was going well until COVID ravished the world. Not long after the schools closed and everything shut down, the pack found its numbers dwindled and the Cubmaster position vacant.

After things started going back to pre-COVID times, Brian brought his guitar, artificial fire and backpack through the doors of the elementary school where he sang songs about the wonders of scouting. He once again built up the packs numbers regaining the title of Cubmaster. Brian is currently the Cubmaster and Scoutmaster of 374.

If you have been to any of the Cub Scout day camps or Camporees in recent years, you have probably seen Brian running a station or leading a group in song. In 2018 Brian was awarded the District Award of Merit for his countless hours of volunteer service to the council and he successfully completed Wood Badge in the top tier beaver patrol. His daughter Sarah and son Ben are currently working on their Eagle Scout projects.

Brian Market considers what he gives to scouting as a mission to give back to a program that helped him through some less than ideal circumstances in his life growing up. The Scouters that were there for him not only helped him through tough times, they taught him life skills and lessons that he now passes on to the youth in his pack and troop.

2023 MEMBERSHIP FEES

EFFECTIVE AUGUST 1, 2023

Beginning August 1, 2023, all new youth and adult members who join Scouting will be enrolled in a 12-month membership cycle and BSA will cease prorating fees. Both youth and adults will pay the full annual membership fee and will renew their membership on the anniversary date of joining Scouting. All pro-ration of membership fees will be eliminated. Each registered member of the BSA will receive an email notification with a registration renewal link beginning 60 days before the anniversary date they joined Scouting. Unit Leaders will receive a copy of the email and should stay engaged in the membership renewal process just like rechartering.

It is important to note, existing members will renew their membership during their normal registration/recharter cycle through February 2024. Moving forward all members will renew on their anniversary date.

- Existing members' Anniversary date will be their unit recharter month.
- New members' Anniversary date will be the month they joined.

This new process will help streamline the rechartering and membership renewal process for units and councils. Additional information on this membership renewal process will be forthcoming in the very near future.

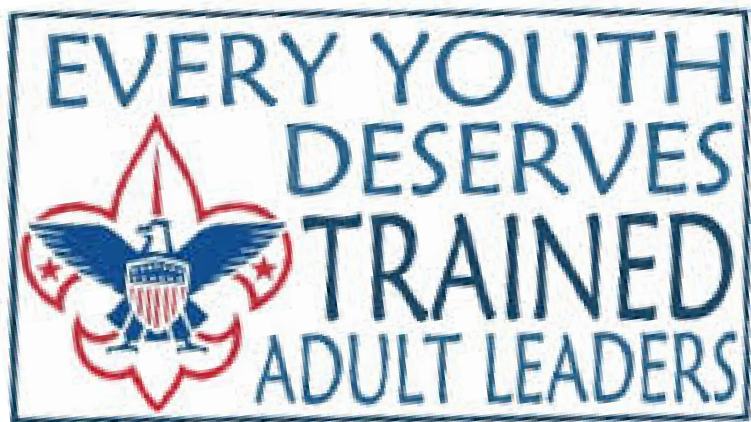

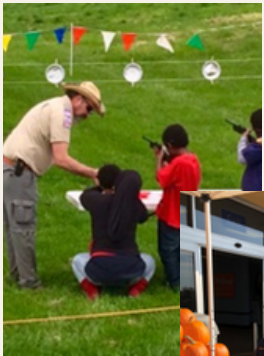

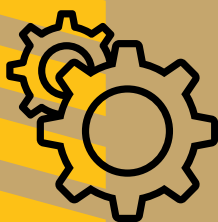
