VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT



Linda Schweickart became involved in scouting when her son Luke crossed over into Troop 301. A little uneasy with letting her young scout travel to Yellowstone National Park, Linda volunteered to help with the trip. While on the multiday journey Linda started reading the Boy Scout handbook. Her initial assumptions were that scouts were all about outdoor skills like camping and building fires. Linda soon realized that the goal of the program is about leadership and how to be a good community member. Throughout that trip she became more interested in the program and started camping with the troop on a regular basis. She decided to become even more involved and became a committee member.

Not long after Linda became more involved with the troop, the current Scoutmaster unexpectedly resigned their position. Linda was asked to take on the role of the new scoutmaster, but initially said no because she didn't feel like she was the right person for the job. With the encouragement of her son Luke, Linda agreed to become Scoutmaster until someone else could take over the role. Linda decided to be the best Scoutmaster she could be, taking every training opportunity that was affered.

offered. She took a number of classes at University of Scouting, Merit Badge University, completed IOLS and earned her Wood Badge beads.

Even though this was supposed to be a short term position, Linda served as Scoutmaster for 5 years averaging over 30 camping nights each of those years. Under her leadership, the troop grew from a handful of boys to 35 scouts when she handed over the reins.

Linda attributed her success to following the program exactly the way it is supposed to be implemented and working on things like the National Outdoor Challenge.

The skills Linda acquired and built on through courses like Wood Badge, not only helped her as a leader in scouting, but also helped her become a better leader in her profession as a Registered Nurse. Linda never viewed herself as a team leader, but more as a good reliable worker. She credits the skills she has learned as an adult leader in molding her into a leader at work and earning the Nurse of the year award.

Aside from her exemplary work as a Scoutmaster, Linda is a Vigil member and Associate Advisor for our Order of the Arrow Kiondaga Lodge and member of the Ole Buzzards. Linda was awarded The District Award of Merit and the Silver Beaver Award in 2019.

When I posed the question, why have you given so much of your time to the program, Linda said, it's worth it. The program is not only about camping and building fires, it's about helping scouts become good people and leaders. It's about teaching them to be the 12 points of the scout law and being successful in whatever they decide to do. Watching the scouts change into young leaders and good citizens is worth all of the time she has given.




