The National Jamboree is open to any registered Scout who is at least a First Class Scout and 12 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree (July 21, 2021) but has not reached his/her 18th birthday by the last day of the Jamboree (July 30, 2021). Cost is expected to be \$1950 per participant. Set up monthly electronic payments and have all fees paid by January 29, 2021 and save \$150!

The Buffalo Trace Council will have one troop consisting of 32 youth and eight adults. To submit a NEW application, Scouts and Scouters will need a my.scouting username and password. If you do not have a my.scouting account, please go to my.scouting.org and follow the directions to create an account. Your member ID number will be needed to set up the account. Additionally, youth participants must submit a reservation with the Buffalo Trace Council, complete the Buffalo Trace Council 2021 National Jamboree Payment Policy form and send it with a nonrefundable deposit of \$150 to the Eykamp Scout Center. See council website for details.

Fee Increase Communications

For more than 100 years, Scouting has helped build future leaders by combining educational activities and lifelong values with fun and adventure in the outdoors. As we continue the Scouting mission, it is important that we keep pace with an ever-changing world. While costs to the organization have increased every year, the National Council Boy Scouts of America has worked to keep the annual membership fee as low as possible by subsidizing core costs, including liability insurance we must carry to cover all official Scouting activities. We kept the cost low to make Scouting available to as many young people as possible but keeping the cost artificially low for many years now magnifies the impact of changes.

To ensure we have the resources to fulfill the promise of Scouting despite increasing operating costs, the National Executive Board of the Boy Scouts of America has made the difficult but necessary decision to increase the annual membership fee effective January 1, 2020 to:

- \$60 for youth members in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouts,
- \$36 for youth members in Exploring,
- \$36 for adult members (includes cost of background check and Scouting Magazine)
- \$60 for unit charter fees



Every dollar of the national membership fee will go toward the cost of essential services, including liability insurance for those participating in approved Scouting activities, program resources, safety standards, youth protection and personal safety training, and services to councils nationwide to sustain Scouting. The Buffalo Trace Council will not receive any funds associated with the National fee increase. Families enjoy Scouting because of its high value and reasonable price. Even with an increase in the membership fee, Scouting will remain significantly less expensive than most youth programs in the area, and certainly more impactful long-term. National BSA will continue to take every measure to reduce operational expenses and the Buffalo Trace Council will continue to fundraise locally to support our program and provide assistance when needed.

We are committed to ensuring that all youth can experience the character-building benefits of Scouting regardless of their financial situation. In addition to our existing council and unit membership assistance, the National Council has established a national Growing Future Leaders Fund, which is funded entirely through donations, to provide additional financial support to those who need it.

Thank you for your continued role in empowering a generation of future leaders of character through Scouting programs.




