

SCOUTING ADVENTURES



Cub Scouts

Cub Scouting is a family and home centered program that develops ethical decision-making skills for youth in kindergarten through fifth grade. Activities emphasize character development, citizenship training, and personal fitness.



Scouts BSA

Scouts BSA is for boys and girls ages 11-18. Scouts develop awareness and appreciation of their role in their community and become well-rounded young men and women by advancing through the program using the Scout Oath and Scout Law as guides.

Scouts progress in rank through achievements, gain additional knowledge and responsibilities, and earn merit badges that introduce a lifelong hobby or prospective career.



Venturing

Venturing provides experiences to help young men and women, ages 14-20, become mature, responsible, and caring adults.

Young people learn leadership skills and participate in challenging outdoor activities which include access to BSA camping properties, a recognition program, Youth Protection Training, and leadership courses.



Exploring

Exploring teaches important life and career skills to young people, ages 14-20, through career experiences and mentorship provided by community and business leaders.

The program equips young people with character and leadership skills through hands-on learning experiences with experts in the field.

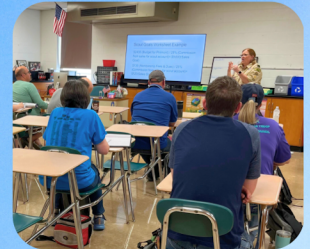

EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

CUB SCOUT DAY CAMP

Cub Scouts across the Buffalo Trace Council attended our Day Camp programs in June. Three camps were held throughout the month: one at the Eykamp Scout Center, one at Oubache Trails Park in Vincennes, and one at Dubois County 4-H Fairgrounds in Huntingburg.



FALL FIELD DAY

After a successful recruitment campaign through August and September, our Cub Scout Packs brought along their new members to launch their very own rocket at our three Fall Field Days. Cub Scouts totaling over 400, new and old, joined the fun and competed in team building games, shooting sports, and the much-anticipated rocketry. These events in Evansville, Vincennes, and Dale were the first outdoor activities that our new Scouts participated in. What better way to welcome them than to blast off into the stars?



MERIT BADGE CAMPOREE

Our First Merit Badge Camporee was held offering 11 Merit Badges to over 100 participants. Scouts enjoyed a weekend at Old Ben learning how to tie a fly to tree identification and star constellations.



TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

In April and October, the Council offered three focused trainings for our leaders:

Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO) Training shared a fun, exciting, and required training for leaders responsible for Pack family campouts.

Leave No Trace (LNT) Training was offered to individuals over the age of 14 and shared about the seven principles of Leave No Trace and how to effectively teach those principles and associated skills.

Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS) Training provided a practical, hands-on approach to basic outdoor Scout craft skills that is a must for Scoutmasters, Asst. Scoutmasters, and Venture Crew Advisors to be successful.

- Financial Stability

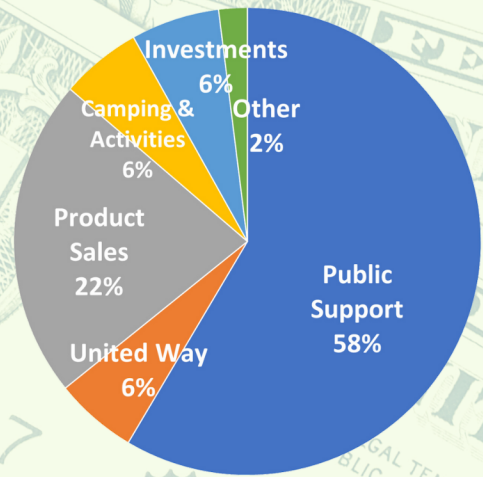

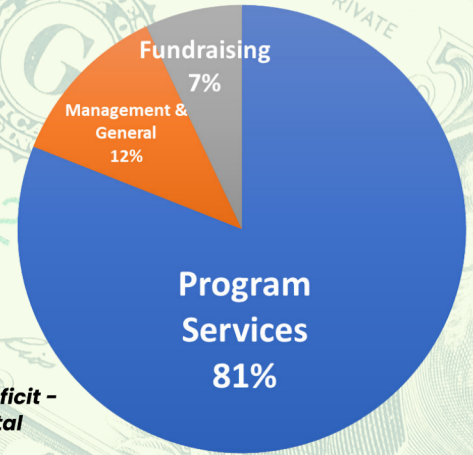

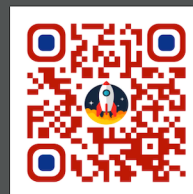
