Volunteer Spotlight: Leisa Barber

Leisa Barber started her scouting journey as a Girl Scout while her family was stationed in Germany and Ft Benning, Georgia. Leisa was reintroduced into scouting in 2009 when she registered her sons for Cub Scouts in Pack 105 in Rockport, IN. She took on a leadership role as the Bear den leader, eventually becoming the Cubmaster and finally the Committee Chair of the pack. At the next level, she became the Scoutmaster, then the Committee Chair of Troop 105. Leisa founded Venturing Crew 105 and served as Crew Advisor for 3 years before giving her full attention to Council Events and Training.

When Leisa took on that first role of Den Leader, she wanted to know every aspect of scouting and how things worked. She took her first in-person Den Leader specific training and enjoyed the experience so much, she loaded up a minivan with all of the leaders from 105 and drove them to Evansville for the next Cub Scout specific training. From that point on, the adults in her units were fully trained, including IOLS/Baloo, staying on top of all new training offered by Scouting America.

When it comes to training, Leisa said, "You can't do something with youth until you understand how it works." She also stated that she uses everything she has learned in scouting outside of scouting, from daily interactions to her job.

Leisa transitioned from unit-level to district and council-level events, taking on many big roles. She has been the Day Camp Director, NYLT Scoutmaster for 2 years, Assistant Scoutmaster for a Wood Badge Course, and Unit Commissioner. She has held many other roles at the district and council level, but has a passion for the roles intertwined with training.

In addition to her natural curiosity about how things work, Leisa credits her love for training to the amazing instructors she had when she first started down that path. Once she started instructing, she found that the people who run the courses are like one big family.

Her biggest mentor through the years was Ed "Bear" Boudreau. Bear was extremely passionate about helping others and would always be there for Leisa whenever she needed him. Since Bear's passing, Dave Hampton has filled that void.

Leisa is currently a Brotherhood member of the Kiondaga Lodge and was awarded the District Award of Merit, Silver Beaver, Silver Arrowhead, and Commissioner of Science. She is employed at IN*SOURCE, where she is a Transition Coordinator, helping people from age 14-26 navigate the transition process from High School into adult life. — Christian South-Alderson

It is presented annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 units in the district. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside of Scouting or both. The nature of noteworthy service may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or to a small group of youth over an extended period of time.

Silver Beaver Award

The Silver Beaver Award is a council-level distinguished service award. Recipients of this award are registered Scouters who have made an impact on the lives of youth through service given at the council level. This is the highest award a council can bestow upon a volunteer. This award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters.
