VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

DAVEWINKLEMAN



If you have attended Woods of Webelos, a council camporee or adult leader training in recent years, then you have probably eaten food prepared by Dave Winkleman and his kitchen crew. Along with his cheerful service of making sure everyone is fed, he devotes a lot of time helping the Order of the Arrow Kiondaga Lodge. Dave started his journey in scouting when he joined Cub Scouts, followed by some time at the troop level. After graduating high school, Dave entered the oil industry where he spent the next 42 years managing and maintaining pumping units until his retirement. In 1988 Dave started helping out with his son's Cub Scout pack, becoming a leader in 1989. When his son crossed over to troop 248, Dave started out as an assistant Scoutmaster, becoming the Scoutmaster two years later. Dave served as the Scoutmaster, and then would step down to assistant once another leader wanted the role and back to Scoutmaster when the role needed to be filled for the next 16 years.

In 1995 Dave became a chapter advisor for the Kiondaga lodge until the chapters were phased out. Dave has been active with the ceremonies teams, an advisor and cook for Order of the Arrow activities and events. He is a Vigil Honor member and was awarded the Founders Award which recognizes Arrowmen who have given outstanding service to their lodge.

Through the years he has been heavily involved in running and helping with activities and training in the Buffalo Trace Council. Dave was the day camp program director over Webelos camp, a part of the training team that teaches at BALOO and IOLS, an Ole Buzzard and mowed Old Ben Scout Reservation off and on since the mid 90's.

In 2004 Dave was awarded the Silver Beaver, along with being awarded the District Award of Merit in the Native Trails District and Algonkian District for his extensive service to scouting. Dave is Wood Badge trained and earned his beads.

For the past 35 years Dave Winkleman has given countless hours to serve the youth in our council. Thank you for everything you have done and continue to do for Scouting.

Weekend Training

Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation

BALOO is a fun, exciting, and required training for all those in your Pack who are in charge of conducting a Pack family campout. Pack's conducting overnight campout must have a person on site who has attended BALOO training. It is recommended that each Pack have at least two BALOO trained adults. This course is designed to introduce Cub Scout leaders to the opportunities for pack overnight camping. It's more than just camping overnight it's a fun, successful event!

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills

What skills are needed for a Scout to advance from Tenderfoot Scout to First Class Scout? What are the basic skills any Scout needs to survive in the great outdoors?

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills teaches those skills. A practical, hands-on approach to basic outdoor Scout craft skills is a must for a Scoutmaster, Assistant Scoutmaster, and Venturing Crew Advisor to be successful.

Leave No Trace Training



Your course will be facilitated by the best of the best. Proven leaders and experienced trainers, your staff will consist of men and women from all parts of scouting and from all walks of life. They are a diverse group of seasoned scouters.

Upon successful completion of all course requirements, you will receive your certificate and Wood Badge beads, neckerchief and woggle.

The Wood Badge experience has served as a source of inspiration and a practical guide to tens of thousands, who have earned their beads.

Who can attend?

To attend a Wood Badge course, you must:

- 1. Be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. (Youth 18 and older may attend as long as the appropriate Youth Protection guidelines are followed. They do not need to be registered in an adult leadership role.)
- 2. Have completed the basic training courses for your Scouting position. <u>Required Training by position</u>.
- 3. Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete the Annual Health and Medical Record form (available at www.scouting.org). Parts A, B, and C are required. Based on the stresses of the course, part C should always be used.
